

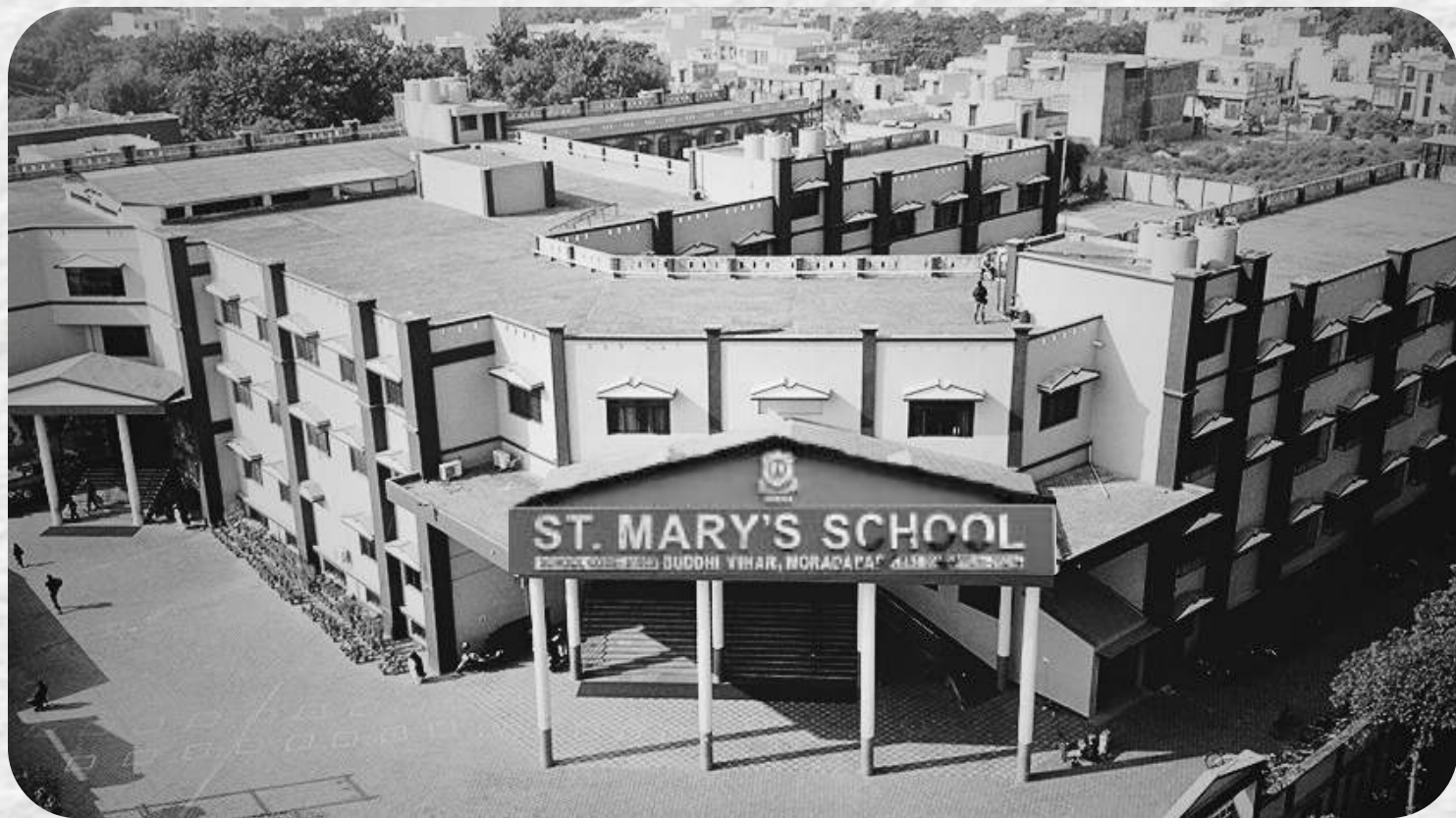

On May 13 2025, as the country continued with its routine pace, students of Grades X and XII awaited a moment that marked the culmination of an academic year—the CBSE board results. With a few keystrokes and a roll number, months of effort, revision and perseverance were brought into sharp focus. Among the standout performers were three students from Grade X Shambhavi Bharadwaj scored a remarkable 98.2%, Gauri Chauhan and Riddhi Garg each achieved an impressive 98%. All three were recognized at the district level for their academic excellence—a reflection not just of high scores, but of consistent performance & discipline throughout the year.



This year's results offered more than academic data. They reflected a deeper narrative of persistence. Drawing inspiration from Albert Einstein's iconic equation, $E = mc^2$, the school adopted a symbolic interpretation: "Excellence = mind $\times$ consistency". In this context, "mind" represents intent, focus, and potential, while "consistency squared",

denotes the sustained effort shown day after day—through challenges, routine, and uncertainty. The results demonstrated that academic excellence is rarely sudden. It is the outcome of steady work and deliberate choices over time. The Grade XII results also reflected commendable performances across streams:

Soha Ali (Humanities) led with 95.6%, followed by Manvi Kohli (Humanities) with 94.6%. Prakriti Baliyan (Commerce) with 92.8%, Mansi Prajapati (Science) with 92%. The school's overall performance was a testament to both the students' dedication and the supportive academic environment that guided their journey. These results underscore the importance of mindset and consistency in long-term academic achievement. As psychologist Angela Duckworth observed, "Enthusiasm is common. Endurance is rare." This year's achievers have demonstrated that rare endurance—steady, deliberate and deeply earned. We extend our congratulations to all students and wish them continued success in their future endeavours.

Serendipity refers to the occurrence of fortunate events or discoveries by chance. It's the act of finding something valuable or agreeable without actively looking for it. Essentially, it's a happy accident or a fortunate surprise. The term was coined by Horace Walpole in the 18th century. E.g. 'They found each other by pure serendipity'
